Every one of us feels the impact of these cases, some of us more so than others.

For many of us, navigating these challenging times is difficult. We acknowledge that different life and lived experiences may cause circumstances to weigh more heavily on some of us than others. Please be mindful of this, and borrow from Dr. Michael Eric Dyson, that we should cultivate empathy, and develop our civic imagination and a democratic impatience for injustice.
