And best of all, all Auction proceeds go directly to support student scholarships. At Accepted Students Day on April 22nd, 300+ visitors were on campus throughout the day. Kudos to Dean Lauren Wilshusen and the entire Admissions team, along with everyone who helped to run the event and welcome our prospective students and family members, giving them a true sense of our supportive MassArt community.

It was such a pleasure seeing the All School Show, and the exceptional and varied work created by our students. Making sure I got to all three shows kept me hopping! I was honored to have the chance to award the First Prize for the show, from a selection of finalists, to Linnea Pappas-Byers' (Printmaking '22) remarkable sculpture, "Untitled." Thank you to all the students who shared their work, the student curators from each department, and to SGA VP Dan Miasciewicz (Illustration '24), who coordinated the Awards Show with help from fellow students.

Our prolific faculty members are always busy in their own practices, as well as in classrooms and studios. Among the recent achievements we've heard about: Cheryl Clark, Assistant Professor in Liberal Arts, published a new book of poetry, They Can Take It Out. Jeanette Eberhardy, Director of First-Year Writing, shared her expertise in "Telling the Story that Exists in Your Art," at the Associated Writers Conference in Philadelphia. Karen Hampton, Associate Professor of Fine Arts 3D, opened "Origins" at the Crisp-Ellert Art Museum at Flagler College (FL), focused on her textile-based work that explores stories of the African American diaspora. Congratulations to all- thank you for sharing your expertise and carrying the MassArt banner!

I am delighted to share the news that MassArt alumnus Sopheak Sam ('20, SIM) was awarded a Fulbright for the 2022-2023 academic year. He will be traveling to Thailand in September to complete an Open Study/ Research Award entitled Bridging Kantrum Across Generations: Sounds, Sights, and Spirituality in Surin Province.

MassArt was well represented at the recent COF 25th Anniversary and Collaboration Awards Celebration with three awardees. Laura Flynn, Senior Director of Student Engagement, won a COF Champion Award for her 10-plus years of planning, developing and facilitating great student programming, and for "adding vibrancy, authenticity, and dedication" to her COF work. Amy Holland, Study Abroad Advisor, won a COF Catalyst Award for her work in streamlining communications and processes for J-1 Exchange Visitors, and in developing consistent campus protocols to support exchange students. Maureen Keefe, Vice President of Student Development, won a COF Catalyst Award for being a longtime advocate for the consortium and the sharing of resources.
