

Internship Program Overview

"The MassArt internship program provides structured internship experiences for academic credit that help prepare MassArt students for careers. Through internships, students can apply their skills and experience in a professional environment, acquire business skills, explore potential career paths, and start building a professional network."

Internships: Applying for Academic Credit

Once an internship is secured, students in all academic majors are eligible to apply for credit before beginning the internship. Their faculty internship advisor evaluates and approves the experience for 3 academic credits towards degree completion. Credit-bearing internships approved for credit may be completed in the fall, spring and summer semesters.

An Internship is an Academic Class

As part of their application for internship credit, students must describe how their selected internship will further their academic, professional and career goals, and set specific learning objectives. Students also identify a Faculty Internship Advisor within their academic department to review, approve or decline their application for internship credit. Final approval for awarding credit and a grade for any internship submitted for credit is at the discretion of the Faculty Internship Advisor.

If an internship is approved for credit, the Company Internship Supervisor, the Student Intern and the Faculty Internship Advisor agree to the terms of the written agreement outlining the internship responsibilities, goals and timeframe.

The Faculty Internship Advisor submits a final grade at the conclusion of the internship after reviewing the required documentation including the mid-term and final evaluations completed during the internship by the Student Intern and their Company Internship Supervisor.

Individual academic departments determine how internships complement the curriculum and desired learning outcomes for their students.

The Role of Career Development

The Career Development office provides administration for the internship program by reviewing the student's internship application to ensure it meets minimum program requirements and facilitating academic approvals. The office also accepts the subsequent documentation which includes a mid-term and final evaluation submitted by the Student Intern and their Company Internship Supervisor during the internship. Students engaged in current internships are encouraged to contact Career Development for any assistance that may be needed during their internship experience.


Career Development also offers students assistance with the internship search including an online database of approved internship listings, one-on-one appointments, resume and cover letter

critiques, and interview resources. Career Development also coordinates an annual Internship and Job Fair.








