

BUFFALO: A MESSAGE TO OUR COMMUNITY

May 16, 2022

Good Afternoon.

I write to you following the hate fueled crime of racial violence that took place in Buffalo, New York on Saturday. Ten people died, several others were injured, and a community has been traumatized. The official reports leave no doubt that this was a racially motivated assault. All who died were loved. They were simply going about their day. Each one will be forever grieved by their loved ones - each one should be forever grieved by all of us.

Our MassArt values of creating an environment that is just, compassionate, and equitable, of honoring courage, honesty, mutual respect and self-expression and using the power of art and design to transform the world remind us that as a community of artists, scholars, educators, and advocates we have unique tools and ways to strengthen and reinforce our humanity, build community, and combat hate. We cannot allow this act - as well as the litany of egregious acts inflicted on women, LGBTQ, and communities of color, nor anti-Asian, anti-Semitic and anti-Muslim attacks - to weaken our resolve to use our art and our humanity in service to the greater good.

As we move through our year-end milestones and celebrations this week, as a community, and as individuals, let us commit to care for one another. As we acknowledge the accomplishments, resilience, inspiration, and creativity of our graduating class, we will also look ahead and create space for deliberate conversations and tangible actions that put our values to work.

Incidents of violence impact members of our community in different ways.
