| Tuition and Fees For exchange programs this is the same as your MassArt tuition. For third party provider programs, this is the tuition listed on their website. | Insurance Health Insurance while you are studying at another institution is required by MassArt. Travel outside of the U.S. requires purchasing health insurance that will cover you overseas. The cost is about \$50/month and you can see more information about it on our website. | -\$ | | |
