Memoir Incubator, Grub Street Literary Center, June 2018-May 2019

Grub Street's highly selective incubator classes give writers an opportunity to focus on one book, for a year of intensive instruction. I am now working on the next draft of *Nest*, a memoir of two impractical educators seeking sustainable housing for their family, in one of the most expensive markets on earth, during a housing crisis that continues for thousands of Americans. I hope to complete the next draft by October 2019.

MFA in Creative Writing, Seattle Pacific University, August 2009

Seattle Pacific University's low-residency MFA program in Creative Writing focuses on arts and faith in classic literature and contemporary writing. I studied creative nonfiction with mentors Robert Clark and Leslie Leyland Fields over three Santa Fe residencies and two Whidbey Island residencies. The SPU MFA is directed by the editor of Image Journal of Arts and Religion.

My critical thesis examines the culinary nonfiction of Robert Farrar Capon's *Supper of the Lamb* and M.F.K. Fisher's *How to Cook a Wolf*. My creative thesis includes a series of stories about my work as caretaker for a blind woman, and a series of stories about house-hunting and homefinding in New England.

The Great Conversation for First-Year students, approximately 30 sections in nine years

Each year, I teach three or four sections of this core requirement for first-year students. I provide tools to help students to improve their writing and revision skills, as well as their skills in civil discourse. Students craft four formal essays in a series of drafts, in addition to shorter assignments. This seminar course covers subjects such as calling and vocation, love and justice.

Intro to Creative Writing, three sections

In the introductory course for creative writing, I work with students to develop daily writing habits in the four basic genres, and to craft a polished portfolio.

2013-Present College Application Essay Coach, Lexington Prep School, Lexington MA

I serve as one-to-one essay tutor for 20 (or more) international high school students each year. LPS offers intensive sessions over Thanksgiving, Christmas, and summer breaks. I have helped more than 300 students to develop story arcs and to choose powerful verbs. I occasionally teach SAT and SSAT essay construction, as needed.

2012-2015 Site Manager, Episcopal City Tutoring SAT Workshop, Hamilton MA

Episcopal City Tutoring offered an innovative nonprofit SAT prep program. Each suburban prep center covered the cost of a similar center in an underfunded neighborhood within the Boston diocese of the Episcopal church. My staff provided 10 weeks of SAT prep each fall and spring. The program dissolved after changes to the 2015 SAT exam.

2004-2005 Writing Tutor, Endicott College

I tutored international students in the writing center. I acted as an emcee for a required seminar on plagiarism for 200 students.

I turned a low-cost birthday party into a six-page glossy feature in a high-end crafts magazine.

Nest is a memoir about two idealists from the midwest who were unprepared for the cost of the northeast, and their two children who will never have the luxury of such naivete. In the housing crisis of 2008, my family was financially stuck in our three-room condo overlooking Gloucester Harbor. Those 600 square feet were the perfect size for one person, not two adults and two adolescents vying for space. Banks stopped lending. After three failed bids for homes, our buying potential evaporated when my student loans came due. My family became suburban renters in a nearby town, with our 20-year roots cut out from under us, losing money month by month. **Nest** examines the soul-cost of two educators working hard while not-making-it, north of Boston.
